SUDA LTD: APPENDIX 4C FOR THIRD QUARTER FY2016

PERTH, AUSTRALIA – 29 April 2016: SUDA LTD (ASX: SUD), a leader in oro-mucosal drug delivery, today released its Appendix 4C for the consolidated Group for the third quarter of FY2016. Receipts from customers for the period were \$1.6 million, an increase of 7% quarter-on-quarter and up 8% from the same period in FY2015. The Company generated a positive net operating cash flow of \$0.5 million for the third quarter, compared to a loss of \$0.8 million in the previous quarter.

The receipt of \$0.7 million from the Australian Taxation Office under the R&D Tax Incentive and also \$0.04 million under the Export Market Development Grants (EMDG) scheme boosted the operating cash flow for the third quarter. The cash position as at 31 March 2016 was \$3.6 million.

SUDA's CEO, Mr Stephen Carter, commented: "It's been a busy period for the SUDA team as we progress our negotiations for several licensing agreements. During the period, we announced the strengthening of our IP position for our SUD-002 oral spray for nausea and vomiting and we are working towards lodgement of a new patent application for our second-generation SUD-003 spray for erectile dysfunction. Furthermore, our medical and surgical supplies subsidiary, Westcoast, performed well in the third quarter with receipts growing 8% from the previous year. The strengthening of our cash position ensures that SUDA is financially robust as we finalise our first commercial deals."

SUDA LTD (ASX: SUD) is a drug delivery company focused on oro-mucosal administration, headquartered in Perth, Western Australia. The Company is developing low-risk oral sprays using its OroMist® technology to reformulate existing pharmaceuticals. The many potential benefits of administering drugs through the oral mucosa (ie: cheeks, tongue, gums and palate) include ease of use, lower dosage, reduced side effects and faster response time. SUDA's product pipeline includes Zolpimist®, a first-in-class oral spray of zolpidem for insomnia. Zolpimist® is marketed in the USA and SUDA has rights to the product outside of North America. SUDA's most advanced development-stage product, ArTiMist™, is a novel sublingual malaria treatment for children. In a Phase III trial, ArTiMist™ was shown to be superior to intravenous quinine. Other products in development include oral sprays for the treatment of migraine headache, chemotherapy-induced nausea and vomiting, erectile dysfunction and pre-procedural anxiety.
