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# Appendix 4C: Second Quarter FY 2020

**PERTH, AUSTRALIA – 31 January 2020:** SUDA Pharmaceuticals Ltd (ASX: SUD), a leader in oro-mucosal drug delivery, today released its Appendix 4C for the consolidated Group for the second quarter of FY 2020.

During the quarter, the Company completed a consolidation of its share capital, appointed a new CEO, Dr Michael Baker, who commenced 2 January 2020 and received a refund under the R&D Tax Incentive program of \$928,000.

The Company finalised its development, licence and supply agreement with Cann Pharma Australia and signed two feasibility studies with Spanish company Laboratorios Ordesa and Sanofi Aventis.

Cash receipts for the quarter was \$239,000 with a bank balance at 31 December of \$2,389,000.

Dr Baker commented: “We are very pleased to have created new partnerships with Cann Pharmaceutical, a clinical stage medicinal grade cannabis company; Sanofi, a leading pharmaceutical company; and Ordesa, a well-known Spanish company specialising in baby food and nutrition. Such partnerships highlight the strong interest that we are receiving for our platform technology.”

SUDA Pharmaceuticals Ltd (ASX: SUD) is a drug delivery company focused on oro-mucosal administration, headquartered in Perth, Western Australia. The Company is developing low-risk oral sprays using its OroMist® technology to reformulate existing pharmaceuticals. The many potential benefits of administering drugs through the oral mucosa (i.e.: cheeks, tongue, gums and palate) include ease of use, lower dosage, reduced side effects and faster response time. SUDA's product pipeline includes ZolpiMist™, a first-in-class oral spray of zolpidem for insomnia. ZolpiMist is marketed in the USA and SUDA has rights to the product outside of the US and Canada. Other products in development include oral sprays for the treatment of: migraine headache; chemotherapy-induced nausea and vomiting; erectile dysfunction; pulmonary hypertension; epileptic seizures and pre-procedural anxiety and cancer.
